YACHT SALE AND FOBS

Please Note:

- On being accepted as a club member you will be issued with one electronic fob to enable you to enter the clubrooms and boat park. Additional fobs are available at a cost of \$40.25.
- On resigning from the club, you must return all fobs to the Secretary or a member of the Executive. **You are not permitted to pass your fob** onto anyone who is purchasing your yacht, whether it remains in the boat park or not. New members get allocated a new fob.
- If you sell your boat and it is kept in a boat park, please note that the boat park you hold cannot be a condition of the sale, ie. any potential new member must apply for a boat park and if a park is available, it may not be the park which the boat is currently in.

SAFETY GUIDELINES

It is a requirement of the Bay of Plenty Trailer Yacht Squadron that all skippers of yachts participating in club activities *have read and understood their responsibilities as owner/skipper of the vessel, and their vessel meets the requirements as outlined in the Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations 2025-2028, Part III. The minimum requirement is Category C.*

Basic Standards

- Washboards capable of sealing off the cabin
- Bow and stern fitting suitable for towing
- Cockpit drains – as per approved designs by NZTYA
- Batteries sealed and secured in case of knockdown
- Fuel tank and gas bottles stowed so any leaks will not enter the boat.

General Equipment

- Fixed or portable boarding ladder
- Boat name and sail number displayed on hull and buoyant equipment
- Tool kit
- Towline (twice the length of your boat)
- Anchor of relevant size, chain one boat length, total warp 46 metres
- One 9 litre bucket on a lanyard
- Torch, waterproof (effective for use) with spare batteries
- First aid kit to specifications in handbook
- Navigation equipment
- 1 boat hook
- Reliable compass
- Navigation lights fitted and operational on all yachts sailing after sunset

Emergency Equipment

- Radio receiver for weather reports
- A marine VHF is recommended, although not required
- Fire extinguisher, properly mounted for emergencies

Safety Equipment

- Easily accessible and the correctly sized life jacket for each person on board
- **To be worn while racing (floatation certified where possible) whistle and light if available (crotch strap for inflatable jackets is optional but recommended).**
- 600mm x 600mm orange flag
- Flares, recommended, although not actually required
- Emergency knife (cockpit)

Auxiliary Power

- Outboard motor of 0.6kw per metre of boat length
- Minimum 5 litres fuel, recommended
